Vestry Meeting Highlights

The May meeting was attended by all of the Vestry and full of lively discussion primarily centered around enhancements to the property.

- Barrie Aycock informed the Vestry that there were \$7,500 in cookbook sales in the first month after receiving them. She also expressed a need to continue encouraging people to promote the cookbooks at civic meetings, events, and at area businesses.
- The Labyrinth is scheduled for installation in July, and the location has been moved slightly to avoid damage to tree roots.
- Estimates to convert the area in the Undercroft where the pool table is into another classroom are still being solicited. There is a potential buyer for the pool table; the proceeds from its sale would go to help offset the cost of construction.
- The Vestry is going to seek out a property management company to handle renting and client service on the cottage and the new property.
- One estimate for repairs and necessary renovations to Jane Brice's old house is in hand. The Vestry hopes to start improvements on the property within the next thirty days, so we can begin renting it by the first of August.
- A subcommittee under Buildings and Grounds will be formed to oversee the renovation, recommendation of a property management company, and related matters.
- The mid-year Parish meeting has been scheduled for August 8.

The next meeting of the Vestry will be Monday, June 21.

CREATION KEEPERS:



As we go from spring to summer, now is a time we can check on how much electricity is used to heat our houses. Right now you're probably opening the windows (pollen gone), enjoying the fresh air, and not using your heater or A/C.

When you get your next bill, check and see how much this month cost compared with last month (a comparison is on the bill). How much electricity did you use to heat your house? Next month, with the A/C being used, compare your bill again and see how much electricity you used to cool your house.

Monitoring your bill can help you make wise choices about your heating and cooling settings and potentially help alert you when something is going wrong with a system.

CREATION KEEPERS: RECYCLE

What is your excuse now?

We have a great and clean recycling center in Clarkesville. It is located on HWY 441/17 just across from the fair grounds and directly across from the road leading into the parking lot. They are open Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 8:00 to 4:30.

They take PLASTIC (#1 & 2, no caps), aluminum cans, glass bottles, cardboard (broken down) and paper of all kinds.

Ladies, if you can't get your husband to recycle, do it yourself. Bob, the new attendant at the center, has cleaned the center up. He is there all day, and he will help you unload your recyclable materials. It is just down the road from Ingles, where you can recycle your plastic bags.

On April 29th, several hundred church members and community residents gathered at Southern Bank and Trust for “A Taste of Grace,” celebrating the release of our new cookbook “Let Us Say Grace.” Committee members and other volunteers prepared a sumptuous spread of appetizers and desserts. Around 200 cookbooks were sold during the 2-hour reception.

Cookbook sales have continued at a brisk pace all month. We are over half way through our first shipment of 1000 books, and we have deposited about \$9,000.00 from book sales. We still have a way to go to pay back our loan for the printing costs, but are thrilled with the response from everyone who sees the book. To quote Linda Hill Jordan “This is not your ordinary church cookbook.” Linda has probably sold more books than anyone outside the committee; she takes them with her everywhere she goes and usually sells one or two every day.

We need the participation of everyone at Grace-Calvary in promoting these books. There are several ways books can be sold. Please contact a cookbook committee member if you know of a retail store that would like to purchase books for re-sale, and don't forget this is the perfect gift for a wedding, birthday, graduation, or any occasion. There are different prices for books depending on how they are purchased. We have boxes for individual books and we will ship them for you for an additional \$5 per book.

Prices for Cookbooks

\$20 each is the retail price

\$25 to ship a book by mail media rate (including box)

\$100 for a box of 6 books (one book free)

\$72 wholesale price for a box of 6 books for resale – this is for local shops that purchase the book for re-sale*

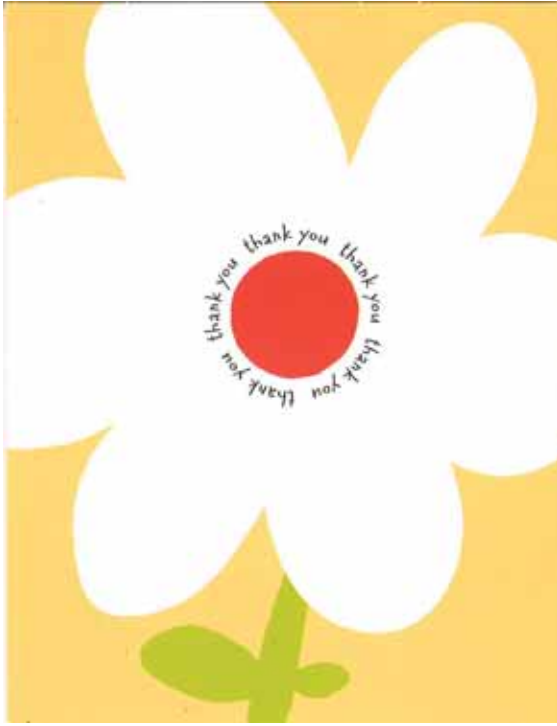

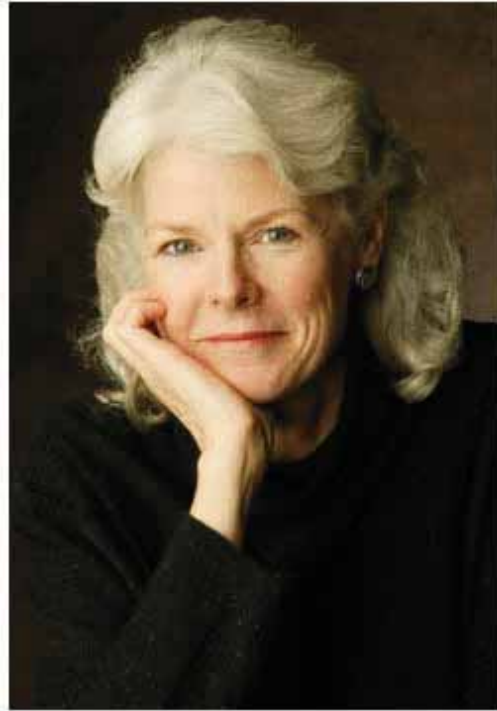
